On August 17th, 2025, we deactivated dearnobody.org from the public with the intention of reconstructing Dear Nobody as a platform. Since then, that is exactly what we have been doing. Throughout this process, we have remained committed to the values that guided us from the start: **Anonymity, Transparency, and Impact over Profit,** and we will continue to uphold them.

We did not fully realize Dear Nobody's potential until submissions started coming in naturally, without any marketing. We are incredibly grateful that you, the people, trust Dear Nobody as a safe space. We want to continue fostering this connection and growing alongside you.

Progress We Have Made

We have strategized carefully to ensure our platform stays true to its core values. Dear Nobody will continue to operate without collecting your personal information, keeping **anonymity** as our highest priority. We have also implemented **end-to-end encryption**, so submissions are protected even before entering our database, especially in cases where unwanted individuals might try to access sensitive content.

We have introduced **Access and Control**, allowing you to permanently remove your submissions using your Public ID and Private ID. This ensures you retain complete control over your work.

Optional **tagging and permissions** provide even more control. Users can add tags to their submissions, helping viewers prepare for potentially triggering content. Additionally, contributors can decide whether their work may be used in

publications, books, zines, or other media. This option is **off by default,** and private submissions remain solely for your eyes and Dear Nobody's Founder.

All of these features were implemented within a month, and we are incredibly excited for what is to come. Dear Nobody will be back up and running on **November 30, 2025.** We hope you are ready.

Thank you for trusting us with your voices and allowing us to provide a space for expression.
